LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY PROGRAM

The VFW with our coalition partners were very successful in the first session of the 103rd Illinois General assembly.

Working with Senator Julie Morrison, Chair of the Illinois Senate Veterans Affairs, committee and representative Lance Yednock, Chair, House Veterans Affairs Committee we successfully passed house bill, 1635, which transferred 4.7 acres from the Lake County Forest Preserve District to the Fort Sheridan National Cemetery. This legislation expanded its cemetery use for another 50 years.

Also, passed was House Bill 925 the veterans state charter bill which gave oversight authority to the Illinois Attorney Generals office. This Bill ensured that the County Veterans Assistance Commission has properly vetted organizations as members of the commission.

Other bills passed, including priority, housing for homeless veterans, and free state certification for dependents of active duty personnel.

Of great concern to the legislative committee is the report from the Illinois department of Revenue due on June 30 on the impact of the disabled veterans homes for exemption on county budgets. We will be watching this report closely as we have already had complaints from counties on the standard homestead exemption as they are exempting those with less than honorable discharge.

The committee will constantly update the District legislative chair on events in Springfield and Washington. What we need from the district is that they communicate with the post on these issues and conduct training sessions to ensure that each post knows how to submit a witness slip in support of our legislative agenda. we also request that the post commanders introduce themselves to their state senator and state representative. You are the subject matter expert to assist them in veterans Legislation.
