2025-2026 Series General Orders No. 3 September 2025

HOLIDAY CLOSURE

State Headquarters will be closed on September 1, 2025, for Labor Day.

NATIONAL BY-LAWS: POLITICS SEC. 702- POLITICS.

No officer or member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States shall in any manner use the Veterans of Foreign Wars for partisan politics and no discussion of partisan questions shall be permitted at any meetings nor shall any nominations, recommendations or endorsements for political office be made, provided this shall not apply to discussion of policies of any organization that seeks to alter our present form of government by force, violence or other unlawful means.

Participation in activities supporting or opposing legislation or the administration of laws related to veterans' welfare or other matters pertinent to the organization's purposes shall be permitted. Such participation shall be consistent with the legislative and welfare programs and policies approved by the National Convention. No Post, County Council, District, or Department shall participate in a labor dispute, either on behalf of labor or management. No member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States shall wear the VFW uniform or VFW cap in any plant or picket line or meeting of employees where a labor dispute arises.

SECTION 703 - BONDS

Please refer to Section 703 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure regarding the bonding of officers. We quote in part from Section 703: "Each officer accountable for funds or property pursuant to any provision of these By-Laws shall be bonded with an indemnity company as surety in a sum at least equal to the amount of the liquid assets for which, so far as can be anticipated, he may be accountable.

The 2024-2025 bonds purchased through Department Headquarters expired on August 31, 2025.

ATTN: DISTRICT OFFICERS

District Meetings are intended to serve as a school of instruction. District Commanders must make sure instruction is taking place at their meetings. Training is very important to the success of our organization; without it, we lose members and Posts. The national website, www.vfw.org, contains a wealth of information that can be utilized in educational settings. Use these materials and more to cause your attendees at District Meetings to leave the meeting knowing more than they did when they arrived. Department representatives are available, from time to time, to provide training at District Meetings or at Schools of Instruction called outside of the normal District Meeting Schedule. Should more than one District decide to join together for a school of instruction, a Department Representative is almost sure to attend if invited.

REGULARLY HELD POST MEETINGS

"Sec. 203 - Regular, Special, and Committee Meetings; Quorum; Authorized Attendees.

Regular Meetings. Posts shall hold at least one regular meeting each month. Failure to comply can result in immediate revocation of the Post Charter notwithstanding the provisions of Section 211 of the Manual of Procedure."

Posts MUST meet each month. Those who do not comply with this by-law are subject to adverse action. Post and District Commanders are expected to ensure compliance.

MEETING MINUTES

Keeping properly formatted meeting minutes is one of the most important duties you have to your post or district. There have been recent incidents of post-meeting decisions, such as the membership approving the sale of property, not being recorded in the minutes. If it is not recorded, it did not happen. Meeting minutes must include the following.

- · You need to include the date, time, and type of meeting
- Meeting location
- · Officers/members present
- Any subject brought to the meeting floor for a vote
 - The result of that vote
- Anything brought to the meeting floor for a discussion

Meeting minutes do not need to be a transcript; just a summary is sufficient. Your minutes must be legible and read and approved at the next regular meeting.

For further information on how to properly record meeting minutes, please refer to Roberts Rules of Order (Newly Revised) Section 48, paragraphs 1 through 8.

POST PURCHASES AND EXPENDITURES

We have received a few inquiries from members and officers regarding the procedures for approving purchases and expenditures in a Post. Specifically, they inquired about purchases or donations that were made without approval of membership prior to the disbursement of funds.

Please refer to Section 218 of the National Bylaws and Manual of Procedures. Sec 2l 8(a)(l)f states that one of the duties of the Commander is "Approve all disbursements of funds properly authorized by the Post by use of voucher or payment order."

Sec 218(a)(5)c states that one of the duties of the Quartermaster is "Disburse funds as properly authorized by the Post using acceptable banking practices." In both instances, it is very clear that Post expenditures can only be made after they are properly authorized by the Post, which means approval of the membership. Please review the procedures you are following to ensure that all your expenditures

and disbursements of funds comply with the National Bylaws and Manual of Procedures.

SECTION 709 - CONTROL OF UNITS

We have received inquiries from Posts regarding the sale or purchase of real estate properties. You are reminded to follow section 709 of the Natina Bylaws in its entirety.

"In addition to other legal requirements under existing local laws or Department By-Laws, no Post, County Council, District, or any holding company or corporation subordinate thereto, shall purchase, sell or otherwise transfer title or any interest in any real estate unless written notice of such proposal has first been given to each member of said unit ten days before such regular or special meeting at which the proposal is to be considered, and then only by two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those members present and voting at such regular or special meeting. In addition, at least thirty (30) days before such meeting, notice shall be provided to the Department Commander, who shall review any sale, purchase, transfer, or encumbrance to determine whether such transaction serves the purposes of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States as prescribed in the Congressional Charter. Failure to comply with these provisions shall nullify said transaction."

RED, WHITE AND BLUE VETERANS SERVICE SUPPORTER PROGRAM

Districts, Posts, and Individuals can once again show their support for our Veterans Service programs through our Red, White, and Blue Supporter Program. We have established three levels of Sponsorships: Red for those making donations of at least \$1,000; White for those making donations of \$500; and Blue for those making donations of \$250. Individuals, Posts, Districts, and Auxiliaries making donations at the above Supporter Levels will receive a beautiful plaque noting their level of support. Signs acknowledging contributions will be displayed at the Mid-Winter Conference in February and at our 106th annual State Convention in June 2025.

PATRIOT DAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2025

Per Presidential Proclamation, September 11 is designated as Patriot Day. The President requests the flag of the United States be flown at half-staff - sunrise to sunset - and a moment of silence be observed in honor of the individuals who

lost their lives on September 11th, 2001, due to terrorist attacks on the United States. You can find a Patriot's Day Speech on the National VFW website www.vfw.org. Once you sign in, click on the tab for "Patriotic Holiday Speeches".

NATIONAL POW MIA RECOGNITION DAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2025


