STATE HEADQUARTERS CLOSURE

State Headquarters will be closed on July 4th and 5th in observation of Independence Day.

SPAM EMAILS

If you receive an email from a Department Officer with a suspicious request, check the actual email address of the sender. Keep in mind that a Department Officer will not ask you send them money or gift cards. Scammers are very skilled at making an email appear that it came from someone else.

RACISM AND DISCRIMINATION

Attention of all members is directed to the purposes listed within the VFW's Congressional Charter. "To maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom" is one of the VFW's chartered purposes; as such the VFW represents fighting for American rights, civil rights and humanitarian impulses that have always guided the VFW's principles.

Today the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Department of Illinois reaffirms its commitment to that chartered purpose by first recognizing that in order to end racism within our organization it is not enough to be non-racist/non- discriminatory: we must be proactive. While we focus on education and mentorship we work to identify, address, and eradicate any and all forms of racial bias and discrimination. We will work to eliminate racial injustices and discriminatory practices within our organization. The ILVFW's leadership is united in the pursuit to end racial bias and discrimination while empowering our members and the greater veteran community towards this collective goal.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND DISCRIMINATION

Attention of all members is directed to Section 901 of the National Bylaws, "Discipline of Members." Members who have committed offenses recognized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may be subject to disciplinary action. Members are reminded that acts of Sexual Harassment, Racial or Sexual Discrimination, and all other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline or conduct determined to be unbecoming of a member will not be condoned. In general, harassment and discrimination consists of any form of verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe and/or pervasive enough to have the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or otherwise interfering with another's ability to participate in VFW events. All members will be treated with dignity and respect.

VFW AND AUXILIARY

For purposes of clarification, we do not operate as a men's organization or a ladies organization, but as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and its VFW Auxiliary. If your Post has an Auxiliary, you will strive to work with the Auxiliary in order to form a common bond of working together to take care of veterans.

<u>ALL QUARTERMASTERS:</u> If you have not created an account on the Online Membership System (OMS), please go to https://www.vfw.org/login.aspx. Below you will see a link to *create an Account*. After following the instructions, you will be identified as the Post Quartermaster.

National Headquarters will mail a PIN number to the address registered for the Quartermaster on your Post Election Report to complete your registration as Post Quartermaster. Once you enter the PIN number, you'll be able to update information for members of your Post, revise your Post Election Report, etc. <u>Important note:</u> The Online Membership System will be unavailable beginning on Thursday, June 30th at 6:30 p.m. for end of year membership processing. All membership transactions should be entered prior to that time. Check back frequently for availability.

ALL POST AND DISTRICT ADJUTANTS

Keeping properly formatted meeting minutes is one of the most important duties you have to your post or district. There have been recent incidents of post meetings being held and important decisions, such as the membership approving to sell property, not being recorded in the minutes. If it is not recorded, it did not happen. For further information on how to properly record meeting minutes please refer to Roberts Rules of Order (Newly Revised) Section 48, paragraphs 1 through 8.

THROUGH CHANNELS

Post Commanders, County Council Commanders and District Commanders are directed to forward all Resolutions or communications relative to FEDERAL LEGISLATION OR TO THE POLICY OR PROCEDURE OF THE U.S. VETERANS ADMINISTRATION OR ANY OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCY to the State Headquarters for endorsement and referral to the Adjutant General.

ATTENTION POST COMMANDERS

Your attention is drawn to Section 218 of the National By-Laws... Among the Duties of a Post Commander, the Commander shall:

Assure that the Commander or one of their representatives attends all properly called District Conventions or meetings and County Council meetings (if applicable).

APPLICATION FOR POST QUARTERMASTER'S BOND

Bond applications for Post Commanders and Quartermasters are available online. Ordering poppies and Convention Delegate Registration can also be done online. NOTE: The maximum amount of bond that can be purchased through State HQ is \$1 Million. This bond only covers the Commander and Quartermaster. If a Post needs a bond greater than \$1 Million or they need coverage for more than Commander and Quartermaster, they MUST purchase from outside source and provide a copy to State HQ.

POPPIES - IMPORTANT!

Although we emphasize Buddy Poppies on Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fundraising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades. Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be a constant reminder that we will never forget those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as "They Gave, Will You?" is a year-round thing, so should the distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies.

Please note the price of the poppies is \$280.00 per thousand for Traditional poppies and \$140.00 per thousand for the metal poppies. Please allow a minimum of 6-8 weeks for processing and shipping when you order your poppies; be sure to specify a date by which the poppies are required, do not use "ASAP.". Poppies can be paid for by check or by credit card. Please submit payment with your order or pay promptly when invoiced.

FORM 990 - RETURN OF ORGANIZATION EXEMPT FROM INCOME TAX

We call attention to the fact that all VFW Posts are required to annually file the IRS Form 990. As a subordinate unit of the Department of Illinois, Veterans of Foreign Wars, you could lose your non-profit status by failing to file this annual report. We are asking all VFW Posts to forward copies of the 990 filed with the IRS starting with the year ending June, 30, 2023 to this office.

NATIONAL CONVENTION-ADVANCE REGISTRATION

A reminder <u>every</u> Post must register a delegate to the 125th National Convention. Section 222 of the National Congressional Charter and By-Laws and Manual of Procedure states - *Each Post shall register, in advance, at least one delegate to the National Convention, by the payment of a fee in the amount of \$25, which fee shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials. Posts failing to comply with this provision shall be considered delinquent and in arrears.*

If your Post has not registered a delegate, *PLEASE DO SO NOW!* We still have a good number of Posts from Illinois who have not registered. If you are unsure if your Post is registered, contact National Headquarters. If you registered online, you must still fill out the paper form and mail it to our National Headquarters. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a \$10 delegate fee. *A delegate registration form is included in these General Orders*.

NATIONAL CONVENTION CREDENTIALS

National Convention Delegates will receive a letter acknowledging their registration of the 125th National Convention. This letter must be presented to the Credentials Committee at the Registration Booth in Louisville, KY. Post Commanders, District Officers, and State Officers are not automatic delegates. They must attend as Post Delegates and carry credentials.

DISTRICT MEETINGS ARE AVAILABLE ONLINE!

All District Meetings have been posted on our State of Illinois VFW Website. Click on the tab for "News" and then click on "Calendar". Commanders, please check the website to insure your events are listed correctly. District Commanders are reminded that if a date or location should change after being submitted, they are to contact State Headquarters to provide the updated information. Please be advised that no State Officer will be assigned to District Conventions.

VOD Program Bulletin for July 2024

Dave Darte, State VOD Chairman

Comrades, I am pleased to report again that the number of students participating in the 2023-2024 VOD contest increased 10% over the previous years' program! While that is truly encouraging, I must also report that those participating represented less than 1% of the number of high school students who were eligible in II and doesn't even consider the number of students who were home schooled. We have a lot of room for growth.

It is not too soon to begin recruiting students for this year's program. Obviously, getting interest in the high school in your community can be very productive. You can talk to teachers, principals, and school superintendents. Another effective method is to get on the agenda for a local school board meeting. There, parents can help convince the administration that incorporating patriotism in the academic curriculum is worthwhile, especially when they realize that students can earn community recognition and cash prizes, even up to \$35,000 at the national level of judging. (I will be sending a detailed list of talking points to aid in presenting the program to all post commanders and copying district chairmen in the near future.)

Remember, that home- schooled students are eligible to participate and are generally even more interested in scholarship opportunities. Your local Regional Office of Education Superintendent may very well help to disseminate your message to those home-schooled families that they have on record.

Lastly, post member can reach out to friends and relatives and there are great posters available from the VFW National Store for a nominal fee that be displayed in schools, libraries, churches, or literally any public place that allows such postings. These posters provide a QR Code with all the information that students need to enter the contest. You just have to provide your contact information.

Comrades, in my opinion, there is no good reason why every post in the state can't recruit participants. let's go all out to help plant the seeds of patriotism that are encouraged by all VFW youth scholarship programs. This will bring great community recognition of our great organization, and can be a very effective recruitment tool.

VFW leadership has established a new annual award, beginning with the 2024-25 program, for the district who recruits the largest number of students participating in both the VOD and PP contests. Because there are varying numbers of posts in each district, we are attempting to level the playing field by dividing the number of students entering the contest by the total number of posts in the district.
