Headquarters Staff Changes

Susie Lynch, Springfield office resigned
Heather Etter will start at State HQ on March 13 as Administrative Operations
Greg Strong resigned as Marion VSO but will stay on staff until April 30 working on Mondays
and Fridays in Marion

Craig Koch was hired as part time VSO. He will be working 3 days a week in Metro St Louis area. He will work out of Post 805 in O'Fallon but will do outreach in Metro St Louis area. He starts on March 6.

Change to All-State Post Requirements

The All-State Award Program for Posts in the 2022-2023 Commander's Leadership Manual required Post to submit a nomination packet for Teacher of the Year to qualify and did not allow a donation in lieu of nomination packet.

State Commander Edwards is allowing a 30 day period whereby a Post may make a donation to the State Teacher of the Year Program in order to receive credit on the State Dashboard. For Post with less than 100 members \$100 donation, For Post with 100 or more members \$200 donation. You can upload donation through the donate here button on vfwil.org or you can mail a check to State HQ. You only have the Month of March 2023 to be able to make a donation and get credit on the State Dashboard. Donation MUST be received before close of business on March 31, 2023. Donations received after March 31st WILL NOT receive credit on the State Dashboard.

NOTE: This change only applies to the State Dashboard. Donations to the Teacher of the Year Program WILL NOT get you credit on the National (All-American) Dashboard.

<u>REMINDER – QUARTERLY AUDITS</u>

Quarterly audits must be signed by the Trustees and Commander prior to submission to the Department. Audits not bearing the required signatures will not be accepted.

SOLICITATION OF FUNDS

Pursuant to Section 214 – "Solicitation of Funds" found in the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, fundraising may only be held for sanctioned purposes. This means no member shall use his/her title, position or office in connection with solicitation of funds for any non-VFW related purpose. Violation of this provision may lead to penalties which may include removal from office.

ALL-STATE POST AWARDS

The 2022-2023 All-State Program is designed to recognize exceptional leadership and teamwork, not only in Membership but in overall Post/District development and VFW Programs. If a Post qualifies to be "All-State", ALL Post members will be recognized for this achievement because THEY ARE A TEAM.

The All State Team of Post Commanders and Post Quartermasters will be made up of Posts who achieve:

- Membership greater than 102%
- Post must hold 2 membership drives/events and submit report to Program Reporting Dashboard
- Posts must be 100% reported on the Department Programs Reporting Dashboard
- Posts must be in compliance with all questions on the National and Department Inspection Sheets (For example: a post that is not incorporated shall not be eligible until proof is provided that they are in compliance.)
- Posts must order at least 5 poppies per member with a minimum of 1,000 Poppies
- Post must have a nomination from Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, and Teacher of the Year Awards. Donations as stated in the Commander's Leadership Manual or as stated above will be accepted if Post does not have a nomination.
- Post must have representation at all properly called District conventions and meetings
- Posts must have representation at all of their respective Regional Commander Calls (A roll-call will be taken)
- Posts must make a \$50 donation to the Service Office Support Program (SOS). This is separate from the Red, White and Blue Program donations.
- New Posts need to attain 50 members to become All-State

The All-State Program runs through June 15, 2023. To receive All-State Awards at the State Convention, the deadline for completion of All-State Criteria is April 30, 2023.

All-State Post Commanders will receive an All-State Post Commanders Cap and Distinguished Service lapel pin.

All-State Post Quartermasters have the option to purchase an All-State Post Quartermaster Cap and will receive a Distinguished Service lapel pin

All-State Post Members have the option to purchase an All-State Team Member cap.

ALL-STATE DISTRICT CRITERIA

The All-State Program runs through June 15, 2023. To receive All-State Awards at the State Convention, the deadline for completion of All State Criteria is April 30, 2023. All-State District Commander's Will receive an All-State District Commander's Cap and a Distinguished Service Lapel Pin. There will be no limits to the number of Districts that can achieve All-State status. The criteria is as follows:

- Membership greater than 100%
- Districts must have 100% of Posts inspected and the inspections must be cleared by the State inspector by April 30, 2023
- Districts must hold a minimum of one School of Instruction and submit a report to State Headquarters
- District must ensure at least 4 Posts hold a membership drive/event and submit report to Program Reporting Dashboard
- Districts must submit 1 of each of the following to Department Headquarters for

judging:

- Patriots Pen
- Voice of Democracy
- Teacher of the Year
- Police Officer of the Year
- Firefighter of the year
- District must forward a record of the Roll Call of Officers and Posts of each District meeting to State Headquarters

ALL AMERICAN POST LEADERSHIP CRITERIA

- Membership greater than 100%
- Must conduct two Membership Recruiting events and submit reports through the All-American Dashboard
- Post Election Report must be submitted to National
- Meet all of the following Program Participation Criteria:
 - Voice of Democracy Minimum of one entry advanced to District judging
 - Patriots Pen minimum of one entry advanced to District judging
 - Hold a fundraiser with the proceeds going to Veterans & Military Support Programs Services (Minimum of \$100)
 - Teacher of the Year award minimum of one entry advanced to District judging
 - Submit a community service report to their department for submission to All-American Dashboard NLT Jun 30, 2023
 - o Buddy Poppy Purchase five per member in the Post

<u>ALL AMERICAN DISTRICT CRITERIA</u>

- Membership greater than 100%
- Must conduct two Membership Recruiting events and submit reports through the All-American Dashboard
- District Election Report must be submitted to National
- Meet all of the following Program Participation Criteria:
 - Voice of Democracy Minimum of one entry advanced to District judging
 - o Patriots Pen minimum of one entry advanced to District judging
 - Teacher of the Year award minimum of one entry advanced to District judging

CORPORATION ANNUAL REPORT

Under the State of Illinois General Not for Profit Corporation Act, the **ANNUAL REPORT** must be properly executed and filed in the Office of the Secretary of State prior to the first day of the corporation's anniversary month each year (the 19th District charter date is 4/4/—so the District QM must have this report submitted prior to April 1st). If filing on time, a \$10 filing fee only is required by statute. If filed later, a statutory \$3 penalty fee must be added. Annual Reports are mailed to the "registered agent" of record. If you do not receive your annual report renewal, you can contact the Secretary of State at (217)782-7808 or on line at www.cyberdriveillinois.com. (Login, then go to

publications, business, and form C 54-Not for Profit Report). NOTE: filing fee is \$10 by mail and online reporting is \$35.

STATE CONVENTION REGISTRATION

Included in these General Orders is the Advance Registration Form for the State

Convention. Delegates can also be registered online by going to www.vfwil.org. The registration fee is \$15.00 until June 2nd, 2023, and is \$17.00 after June 2nd, 2023. Letters of registration confirmation will be mailed to registrants after the proper registration fee has been paid. Registrants will be required to present this confirmation when they check in at the convention registration desk at the Wyndham Springfield City Centre Hotel.

REMINDER: Delegates <u>will not</u> be allowed to vote until such issues have been resolved if the Post is in arrears for supplies, poppies or any sort of financial obligation to the Department. The Post must be bonded, inspected, have an election report on file with Department and National Headquarters for the ensuing year, and all audits **including** the March 31, 2023 audit must be submitted and approved.

Delegate strength to the convention is based on one delegate and one alternate delegate per thirty members or fraction thereof.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Sec. 413 - Arrearages, Deficiencies and Omissions.

The Commander of the District in arrears for financial obligations to Department or National, for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, or failing to have the office of the Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the District is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed District Trustees Report of Audit, District Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation at the Department Convention. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

A properly completed District Election Report shall be submitted to National Headquarters prior to the convening of the Department Convention. There is a blank election report at the end of these orders.

Sec. 212 - Defunct Posts

Any Post with less than ten (10) members, or while under suspension the Post fails to establish a meeting quorum or elect the required officers, its charter shall be revoked and declared defunct with the issuance of a special order by the Commander-in-Chief. **Disposition of Property.** In all cases of surrender, revocation or forfeiture of a charter, title to all real and personal property shall immediately pass to the Department who shall take possession and control for disposition as directed by the Department Council of Administration for the purposes set forth in the Congressional Charter. In addition, the books and records of the Post shall be recovered by the Department.

In case of surrender or forfeiture of a charter, the Department Council of Administration in the case of trust funds or trust property, or both, shall carry out the intent and purpose of such trust to the extent of such funds or property, or both.

Sec. 213 - Arrearages, Deficiencies and Omissions.

Any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to

have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council and District meetings; County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

Sec. 218 (K) - Duties of Commander (Attendance at District Meetings)

Assure that the Commander or their representative attend all properly called District Conventions or meetings and County Council meetings (if applicable).

NATIONAL CONVENTION REGISTRATION

Part 222 of the Manual of Procedure

Please note the recent changes in Part 222 of the Manual of Procedure. Delegates to the District, Department and National Convention shall be elected in April.

Sec. 222 - Delegates, District Convention & Meetings, Department and National Conventions.

Delegates and alternates for the District Convention and Meetings, Department and National Conventions shall be elected at a regular meeting in April. Delegate strength will be based on members in good standing as of March 31st.

Delegates shall not be recognized at the National Convention unless they personally register their completed delegate card with the National Credentials Committee.

Posts instituted after delegate strength has been determined, but prior to convening date of the respective convention or district meeting, shall on the day of institution, elect one delegate and one alternate for each thirty names or fraction thereof according to the number of names listed on the charter application.

124th VFW NATIONAL CONVENTION

Phoenix, Arizona is the host city for the 124th VFW and 109th Auxiliary National Conventions, which will be held July 22-27, 2023. Convention housing will open at a later date. Hotel reservations can be booked via the VFW website www.vfw.org. More information will be released as we receive it.

NATIONAL CONVENTION REGISTRATION

Section 222 of the Manual of Procedure states each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention Registration Fee of \$25 – which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Please note each additional delegate attending the National Convention will have to pay an additional \$10 delegate fee. Information on delegate registration will be available at a later date.

REMINDER - STATE BY-LAW CHANGES

Resolutions having effect on the By-Laws of the Department must be received in State Headquarters by no later than April 30, 2023 so they can be circulated to all Posts within the prescribed time prior to the State Convention. Resolutions affecting Department By-Laws received after that date cannot be considered at this State Convention. ALL RESOLUTIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN PROPER FORM. Any Resolutions received that are not in proper form will be returned for correction. NOTE: in order for your resolution to be included in the State Convention Resolutions Book, it must be received at State Headquarters no later than **April 30, 2023.**

NOMINATION, ELECTION AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

Part 216 of the National By-Laws is quoted below for your information and necessary action. Please note paragraph c.

Sec. 216 - Elected and Appointed Officers; Chairmen and Committees.

- (a) The Post shall elect the Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and three Trustees.
- (b) The Commander shall appoint an Adjutant and Service Officer.
- (c) The Post may elect or the Post Commander may appoint a Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day and/or Guard if required by Post By-Laws.
- (d) The Post Commander may appoint such other chairmen and committees as deemed necessary to conduct the affairs of the Post or as may be required by Post By-Laws.

A number of posts have by-laws that state that Post Officers will be elected in accordance with the National By-Laws or are silent on the election of officers as the National By-Law has precedence. With the change to 216c should review their by-laws and decide if they wish the positions in 216c to be elected or appointed.

Part 416 of the National By-Laws is quoted below for your information and necessary action. Please note paragraph c.

Sec. 416 - Elected and Appointed Officers; Chairmen and Committees.

- (a) The elected officers of each District shall consist of a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain, and three (3) Trustees.
- (b) The Commander shall appoint an Adjutant, Service Officer and Inspector.

- (c) The District may elect or the District Commander may appoint a Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Chief of Staff or Officer of the Day if required by the District By-Laws.
- (d) The District Commander may appoint such other chairmen and committees as deemed necessary to conduct the affairs of the District or as may be required by District Bylaws.

Paragraph c allows Districts to choose between election or appointment of the listed officers. Should the District wish to appoint a Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Chief of Staff or Officer of the Day they need to have this reflected in their by-laws.

Part 417 of the Manual of Procedure

Sec. 417 - Nomination, Election, Installation and Term of Office. Order of nominations and elections.

The order of nominations and elections shall be Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and Trustee(s).

Nomination. A member may be nominated and elected although not present at the meeting. A member making a nomination of an absentee for any office shall have presented to the Adjutant, in writing, the consent of the member being nominated prior to the closing of nominations. Any nominee shall have the opportunity to decline nomination for the office to which they have been nominated before nominations are closed. Nominations shall remain open until the District Convention is ready to vote.

Election. In balloting for District officers, a majority of all the votes cast shall be necessary for election. If there is no election on the first ballot, the name of the comrade receiving the lowest number of votes shall be dropped and so on in successive ballots until an election is made.

Challenging Election Results: If irregularities are claimed with respect to the election to any office, such challenge must be made in a writing containing specific details concerning the irregularities, signed by the challenger, and forwarded to the Department Commander, mailed no later than three (3) days after the election.

Installation. District officers shall be installed before the adjournment of the meeting at which elected. The installation shall be conducted by a member in good standing who holds or has held an office equal to or higher than District Commander. The District Commander-elect shall select the installing officer. An officer who may be absent for good and sufficient reason or cause shall be installed at any succeeding regular or special meeting of a unit of the organization, within sixty (60) days of the date of installation. If not then installed, the office will automatically become vacant.

Term of Office. Officers shall be elected for a term of one (1) year except that three trustees shall initially be elected for terms of one (1), two (2) and three (3) years and thereafter one (1) trustee shall be elected each year for a term of three (3) years. District officers shall take office upon the confirmation of election and installation of the Department Commander by the Department Convention.

INSTALLING OFFICERS:

Installing officers will see that the provisions of Section 216 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure are properly carried out and that all officers are members in good standing and qualified to hold office prior to installing Post officers for the current year. Post officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed.

Post Election Reports must be submitted following Post election of officers in April and no later than June 1 to the National Headquarters. We highly encourage all Post Quartermasters to use the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS). Post Election Reports received electronically will be forwarded to the Department Headquarters.

SPECIAL NOTICE REGARDING DISTRICT CONVENTIONS

The District Convention is held for the purpose of electing your officers for the upcoming administrative year. Any member, not a member of the District Convention, (Refer to Section 404 of the National By-Laws) may attend the Convention, however, they shall have no voice in business discussions unless requested by the Commander, and shall have no voting privileges. Those on official business shall be recognized by the Commander for the conduct of business. (Article IV, Sec. 403 – Regular, Special and Committee Meetings; Convention; Quorum; Authorized Attendees.)

PROOF OF ELIGIBILTY REQUIRED FOR ALL ELECTED AND APPOINTED OFFICERS

Officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed. Proof of eligibility shall be open to and reviewed by the District Commander, Adjutant and Quartermaster prior to installation to office. In the event an elected or appointed officer fails to submit proof of eligibility within thirty (30) days of election or appointment, any right of the officer to hold the office shall be forfeited, the office declared vacant and the eligibility qualifications of such officer shall be questioned in accordance with the provisions of Section 108 of the National By-Laws.

COMMANDERS-ELECT AT ALL LEVELS

Your attention is directed to the fact that the State Commander does NOT ASSIGN a Past Post, District, County Council Commander or a State Officer to be an Installing Officer. This is something that is between you and the Officer you choose.

<u>REMINDER - POST/DISTRICT OFFICER CHANGES OR CORRECTIONS</u>

Please note that changes in Post or District Officers must be reported to State Headquarters immediately. Changes in addresses, phone numbers and e-mail addresses should also be reported immediately – even if changes are made on the Online Membership System (OMS).

These changes are not always transmitted to State Headquarters; please help us keep our records current.

LOYALTY DAY

Posts and Districts are urged to start planning now for Loyalty Day (May 1, 2023) observances in their community. Go to the VFW Store for Loyalty Day Posters, Award Citations and Brochures and Patriotic Holiday Speeches are available at www.vfw.org.

SPRING POPPY DISTRIBUTION

Commanders on all levels should be organizing their 2023 Memorial Day Poppy Distribution. Promotional material is available from the VFW Store Catalog. Every Post is urged to order and distribute Buddy Poppies; poppies can be ordered and paid for from our website — www.vfwil.org. They are available in multiples of 500. All other accessories such as caps, aprons, cans, etc. can be ordered directly from the VFW Store at National Headquarters. Poppies are priced at \$130.00 per thousand; please allow eight to ten weeks when ordering your poppies.

Special Note: If you have ordered your poppies from the State website, please do not send a paper copy of your order form with your check. This will eliminate the possibility of a duplication of your order.

CONVENTION AWARDS AND CITATIONS COMMITTEE:

We are accepting nominees to be considered by our Convention Awards & Citations Committee for our State Convention. Categories for these awards are Outstanding Legislator, Education, Outstanding in Industrial Field, Legal Profession, Athletic Field, Governmental Service, Clergy, News Media, and Outstanding Citizen or Community.

There is no <u>form to fill out...just write down the name, address, sponsoring Post Number, Contact Person and the reason why you feel this individual deserves to be recognized. THE DEADLINE DATE IS MAY 1ST, 2023.</u>

PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY, MAY 15TH

Posts within the Department of Illinois are hereby instructed to fly their U.S. Flag at "half-staff" on May 15th, 2023 in observance of **Peace Officers Memorial Day, May 15th** as authorized by Public Law 103-122. (See law below):

175. Position and manner of display

The flag, when carried in a procession with another flag or flags, should be either on the marching right; that is, the flag's own right, or, if there is a line of other flags, in front of the center of that line.

(A)-(1) (Unchanged)

(iii) The flag, when flown at half-staff, should be first hoisted to the peak for an instant and then lowered to the half-staff position. The flag should be again raised to the peak before it is lowered for the day. On Memorial Day the flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon only, then raised to the top of the staff. By order of the President, the flag shall be flown at half-staff upon the death of principal figures of the United States Government and the Governor of a State, territory, or possession as a mark of respect to their memory. In the event of the death of other officials or foreign dignitaries, the flag is to be displayed at half-staff according to Presidential instructions or orders, or in accordance with recognized customs or practices not inconsistent with law. In the event of the death of a present or former official of the government of any State, territory, or possession of the United States, that Governor of that State, territory, or possession may proclaim that the National flag shall be flown at half-staff.

The flag shall be flown at half-staff thirty days from the death of a President or a former President, ten days from the day of death of the Vice President, the Chief Justice or a retired Chief Justice of the United States, or the Speaker of the House of Representatives; from the day of death until interment of an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, a Secretary of an executive or military department, a former Vice President, or the Governor of a State, territory, or possession; and on the day of death

and the following day for a Member of Congress. <u>The flag shall be flown at half-staff</u> on Peace Officers Memorial Day, unless that day is also Armed Forces Day.

MARCH 25TH ..."MEDAL OF HONOR DAY"

A Resolution was passed by the U.S. Senate which designates March 25th as "National Medal of Honor Day". The day is set aside to acknowledge the more than 3,400 individuals who have received the nation's highest honor. The date of March 25th was chosen to highlight this special day because it was on March 25, 1863, that the first Medals of Honor were presented to six members of Andrews' Raiders. According to the Medal of Honor Society, there are only 83 living individuals who have received the 'Medal of Honor" and the Department of Illinois is proud to be "home" to three of them. They are: Harold Fritz, Post 2078-9, Allen Lynch, Post 4308-5 and Sammy Davis, Post 4549-17. Let's all join in recognizing their dedication and service to our country.

For the 103rd General Assembly, I have reviewed over 300 bills and we have come up with a recommended list of 10 bills, which includes tax credit for caregivers, special license plates for Navy submariners, changes in scholarship act for veterans at the university of Illinois and and a bill to avoid closing of cemeteries on holidays and Sundays to allow for visitation.

>

> I have submitted witness slips on three bills in which we took no position, however we are opposed to house bill 1239 by Rep Meier as it was directing school districts to study the impact of the disabled veterans homestead exemption on their school districts tax base.

>

> A federal bill to give title 38 status to Guard and Reserve retirees seems unlikely at this time as representative, Mike Bost, Chair, House Veterans Affairs committee has recommended that we go back to IDVA and have them fund admission for guard and reserve retirees, who do not have active duty. Illinois is greatly honored to have Rep. Bost from Southern Illinois as chair of Veterans Affairs.

Every post needs to reach out to your state, senator and state representative, they are looking to you for advice on veterans legislation. I know this for a fact is they call me and I asked why they didn't get a call from their post. Please make contact with your legislator and urge that they support our legislative agenda. if anyone has a question on legislation, please contact me I am available.

In August 2002, the VFW with our military veteran coalition partners passed a bill to set aside the last remaining land at Oakridge cemetery for veterans memorial for the Persian Gulf. We did not know then that there would be an Afghan and Iraq war. Since that date, we have revised the memorial, and due to the efforts of the late brigadier general, lou Myers is named the "hands of freedom" memorial, which is symbolic our efforts to sister allies in the Ukraine.

A drawing of the memorial is being submitted to the Illinois veterans advisory council for endorsement, and we have asked the VFW leadership is to have the VFW foundation receive donations for the memorial. We are awaiting a letter from the Department of natural resources who hold title to the land to give us the go ahead on it and at that time I will chair the fund raiser.

I will be asking each veteran service organizations to make a commitment, as this memorial will continue in perpetuity to represent any, and all conflicts that US forces may be engaged in , It include the names of those who died in Nigeria, Yemen, and Syria.

I remember when we started the Vietnam war Memorial, which was the first at Oakridge cemetery. We did this in reverse order Vietnam, Korea, WWII and then WWI and now the hands of freedom. We debated versus the war on terrorism, but felt this represents what America truly stands for, freedom for all.


