BONDING OF ACCOUNTABLE OFFICERS

ATTENTION QUARTERMASTERS: Sec. 703 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States By-Laws requires each accountable officer to be bonded with an indemnity company in a sum at least equal to the amount of liquid assets for which they may be accountable. Posts that are not properly bonded are subject to disciplinary actions.

If you have yet to submit your bond application, one is available on our State of Illinois Website by going to www.vfwil.org. Go to "Resources" and click on "Reports & Forms" on the drop down menu. You will find a blank Bond Application on that screen. Complete the application and mail it, along with the payment to Department. *All bonds not renewed expired on August 31, 2022*.

QUARTERLY REPORT OF AUDIT

Sec. 218 (11) b. of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Manual of Procedure Within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, properly audit the books and records of the Post Quartermaster, Post Adjutant, and any activity, club room, holding company or unit sponsored, conducted or operated by, for or on behalf of the Post and submit a Post Trustee's Report of Audit to the Department Quartermaster for referral to the Department Inspector.

Audits are due at the end of September, December, March and June of each fiscal year. Every report must be in accordance with and upon such form as may be prescribed by the Adjutant General. Post Leadership, remember that the audit is the tool used to inform the Post Membership of the financial status of the Post. We owe our members an accurate and timely reporting. A thorough, complete audit can prevent financial problems down the road.

Those Posts that are delinquent in submitting a Trustee's Report of Audit are subject to being suspended by the State Commander.

Mental Illness and Suicide Prevention Training

SITUATION:

- In 2020: 45,979 people died by suicide in the United States. That is 1 death every 11 minutes. 12.2 million adults seriously thought about suicide; 3.2 million adults made a plan; 1.2 million adults attempted suicide
- Veterans have an adjusted suicide rate that is 52.3% greater than the non-veteran US adult population. People who have previously served in the military account for about 13.7% of suicides among adults in the United States.
- In 2019, 1.6% of former active-duty service members aged 18-25 years reported making a suicide attempt during the previous 12 months. This was an increase from 0.9% in 2009.
- Veterans can experience different types of mental illnesses or disorders, and they can often occur at the same time. Mental illnesses can occur over a short period of time or be episodic. This means that the mental illness comes and goes with discrete beginnings and ends. Mental illness can also be ongoing or long-lasting.

MISSION: To educate and minimize the risk factors associated with mental illness and suicides. All posts and districts that present this training to their comrades can receive credit by selecting "VFW Mental Wellness" under "Veterans Assistance" on the VFW-IL dashboard.

EXECUTION:

- Mental illness and suicide are a very dark subject. One which a lot of people feel extremely uncomfortable speaking about it. Just like in the 1950's, 60's, and 70's speaking about breast cancer, until First Lady Betty Ford brought it out in the open. Today, many lives are being saved because we talk about breast cancer. We have walking and running fund raisers that help with awareness, as well as pink t-shirts and media presentations.
- We need to make suicide and mental illness a part of the conversation. We need to talk about the "Signs". Knowing the "Signs" can help save the life of a friend or even a loved one. Veterans' families especially need to know the "Signs". Veterans and active-duty military still have extremely high rates of suicide in all age groups. Veterans struggle with the experiences they had while serving our country. Ageing veterans can be dealing with the loss of a spouse and/or health issues.
- We all have triggers that can affect how we manage everyday stressors. Stressors such as the Afghanistan withdrawal. How this event was handled by our military and our government affected Veterans of all wars. For Vietnam Veterans it reminded them of the fall of Saigon. For all post 9-11 Veterans they wondered what was all the sacrifice for? Families who lost loved ones are affected.
- Another big stressor for many Veterans is the holidays. Those Veterans that are self-isolated are particularly vulnerable. Some dates or anniversaries of trauma are hard but if they fall during the holidays, it may become more than they can bear. We need to constantly check in on our "buddies", and if they need help get them the help they need.
- The National VFW, along with other service groups, and state Veteran agencies, all provide training and resources to Veterans Service Officers (VSO's) to help Veterans directly create a road map and identify resources to give hope for the future. Programs such as Unmet Needs, employment training, and scholarships for education are just a few examples. Getting every Veteran set up at the VA for evaluation of medical and psychological needs is critical. Along with these programs the VSO's can obtain benefits

to help stabilize the Veteran's finances and give each Veteran time to seek support groups. Support can be found at Vet Centers, the VA, and other non-profit groups. Support might be found in another Veteran, perhaps that older vet that has managed to make it through to a productive life.

- Two groups of Veterans that are often overlooked is our National Guard and Reserve units. They only meet once a month. They are sent back home after deployment. Sometimes they were discharged after deployment and are entirely overlooked and fall through the cracks in the system. The VFW needs to make sure our National Guard and Reserve troops know about and understand what is out there for them. Their families need to know what is out there for them. Too often both National Guard, Reserve, and Active-Duty military that wish to remain in the service do not want to ask for help as it is still a stigma, and they feel it will affect their ability to obtain promotions.
- Many VFW Posts have already adopted National Guard and Reserve units. The "Buddy System" is simply checking on and talking with those you served with. Even checking in with the Commanding Officer, the Senior NCO, or the family readiness person to make sure they are using the "Buddy System" can help save lives. You were with them when they had good days and when things did not go so well. Talking, listening, and knowing the "Signs" can help.
- Lowering the number of suicides means making sure Veterans, their family and friends understand the "Signs" and what to do if they see one or more of these signs is particularly important.
 - 1. Thinking about hurting or killing themselves,
 - 2. Looking for ways to kill themselves,
 - 3. Talking about death, dying, or suicide,
 - 4. Self-destructive behavior such as drug abuse, weapons, etc.,
 - 5. Hopelessness, feeling like there is no way out,
 - 6. Anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness, mood swings,
 - 7. Feeling like there is no reason to live,
 - 8. Rage or anger,
 - 9. Engaging in risky activities without thinking,

- 10. Increasing alcohol and drug abuse,
- 11. Withdrawing from family and friends.
- We need to get these out and keep pushing them. Family and friends need to use the **A.C.E.** system:
 - **A** Ask directly, "are you thinking about hurting yourself?
 - **C** Care comely control the situation. Listen and show concern. Talk to them and let them talk, LISTEN.
 - **E** Escort do not leave this Veteran alone to take care of problems! Get help from a professional. Remove all firearms or other things from this Veteran which could be used to harm himself or herself.
- These are but a few of the things to look for. Veterans are incredibly good at hiding emotions and saying everything is ok. They have learned to push through to complete the mission. It is when things become so overwhelming that we as friends and family need to help. It is critical to step in and provide the support and professional help necessary at this point.
- What can we do? We can get involved, we can educate Veterans and their families to know the "Signs". At our VFW Post we can hand out the cards from the VA with the signs and the Crisis Line information. We can offer to speak at different civic groups. Veterans are everywhere. Just saving ONE life is a huge accomplishment!
- **CURRENT UPDATE**: The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is now: 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline

988

has been designated as the new three-digit dialing code that will route callers to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. While some areas may be currently able to connect to the Lifeline by **dialing** or **text 988 (chat at 988 lifeline.org)**, this dialing code was available to everyone across the United States starting on **July 16, 2022**.

When people call, text, or chat 988, they will be connected to trained counselors that are part of the existing Lifeline network. These trained counselors will

listen, understand how their problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources if necessary.

The previous Lifeline phone number (1-800-273-8255) will always remain available to people in emotional distress or suicidal crisis.

The Lifeline's network of over 200 crisis centers has been in operation since 2005 and has been proven to be effective. It's the counselors at these local crisis centers who answer the contacts the Lifeline receives every day. Numerous studies have shown that callers feel less suicidal, less depressed, less overwhelmed, and more hopeful after speaking with a Lifeline counselor.

SERVICE AND SUPPORT:

• Each Post or District Commander and/or Surgeon or Service Officer at each Post and District should reach out and present the "Signs" at a Post/District meeting. Every Veterans' family needs to know these, and every Veteran should use the "Buddy System", and the A.C.E. systems.

- VA offers Veterans secure virtual tools for mental health care outside the traditional office visit. With the VA Video Connect app, you can access your mental health visits from your home or other preferred location. And you can use other VA Mobile apps to supplement treatment and support your self-care.
- Annie is a VA messaging service that empowers Veterans to take an active role in their care, including their mental health. Messages you receive from Annie could include mental health support, such as tips for reducing stress, setting boundaries, and practicing mindfulness and relaxation techniques.
- The PTSD Coach app provides Veterans with tools to manage their PTSD symptoms. It also provides resources for family members and caregivers looking to support the Veterans in their lives who have PTSD.

For distribution with the VFW October general orders.

The Illinois veterans advisory council met on September 14. This was the first in person meeting we've had in two years. Director Prince announced that the office of Veterans accountability was now operational and the Chicago veterans home was fully staffed and the waiting list is now being used.

Work at the Quincy veterans home is progressing with over \$325 million in improvements.

Chairman Peck announced the election of Elizabeth Soto as the new superintendent for the Veterans assistance commission of Cook County.

The veterans cash lottery now stands at 1.5 million with two more grants being approved one for the Midwest Veterans Closet for \$97,000.

Chairman Peck urged IDVA and the AG Office to put out a news release urging veterans and their families affected by the Camp Lejeune Water Contamination to seek guidance from a certified Veterans Service Officer before filing a suite.

The issue on county coroners not determining if the deceased was a veteran before Signing off on the cause of death was raised and a motion for the Director of Veterans Affairs to write a letter to the president of the Illinois Associaton County Coroners.

The council approved a resolution to support the transfer of <u>4.7</u> acres from the Lake County Forest Preserve to the Fort Sheridan national Cemetery.

The council approved the appointment of Bill Wolff as chairman for the nominating committee for the December election for Chair and Vice chair with Vincent Long and Al Reynolds as members.

The next meeting of the council is December 14.
